Nevertheless he left not himself without <u>witness</u>, in that he did good, and gave us rain from <u>heaven</u>, and fruitful seasons, filling our hearts with <u>food</u> and gladness. And with these sayings scarce restrained they the people, that they had not done sacrifice unto them. And there came thither certain <u>Jews</u> from <u>Antioch</u> and <u>Iconium</u>, who persuaded the people, and, having <u>stoned</u> Paul, drew him out of the city, supposing he had been dead. Howbeit, as the <u>disciples</u> stood round about him, he rose up, and came into the city: and the next day he departed with <u>Barnabas</u> to <u>Derbe</u>.
